Parks are top priority

Our community continues to grow and your association is making progress on a number of fronts. We have recently updated our website to better communicate with you quickly and efficiently on issues such as park play structures and providing feedback to city staff. We continue to enhance the website and encourage you to bookmark

www.cardinalcreek.org, subscribe to the new RSS feed or join our mailing list so we can deliver important information and reminders to you at the speed of the information age.

At our March meeting, the Cardinal Creek Community Association's 2007 priorities were established by a public, open vote to be the following:

- 1. Parks and Rec Facilities/Bicycle Paths
- 2. OC Transpo/Transportation
- 3. Traffic Issues
- 4. Environmental Issues
- 5. Neighbourhood Watch
- 6. New Home Builder Issues

It was determined that the number one issue facing our community is the lack of active parks for our kids to play safely. Residents raised issues such as the tardy development of Valin Park, the slow progress on Park 18-B preliminary work, and the need for City of Ottawa Kids Summer Program(s) for Cassia, Frenette and other parks as being top priorities in this rapidly growing area. This issue is probably the most difficult one to make progress on due to the joint responsibilities of the developer and the City of Ottawa. However, Councillor Bob Monette and Mayor Larry O'Brien are aware of our Association's concerns and are working on resolving these issues.


OC Transpo express bus frequency, increased connectivity to Trim Road Park & Ride and lack of adequate bus coverage is the second highest priority for 2007. - 5. Surveillance de quartier
- 6. Enjeux reliés aux constructeurs de maison

Les résidents ont fait remarquer le retard dans le développement du parc Valin, le progrès insuffisant des travaux préliminaires au parc 18-B, ainsi que la nécessité pour la ville d'établir des programmes récréatifs pour enfants dans les parcs Cassia, Frenette et les autres parcs de notre secteur en croissance rapide. Le développement des parcs est une responsabilité conjointe entre les développeurs et la ville d'Ottawa, ce qui rend plus difficile l'avancement des travaux. Le conseiller Bob Monette et le maire Larry O'Brien sont aux faits de ces problèmes et travaillent à les résoudre.

La fréquence de passage des autobus express d'OC Transpo, le niveau de service au Parc-o-bus Trim, et l'insuffisance de circuits d'autobus dans le secteur, est en seconde place dans la liste des priorités pour 2007. Une rencontre avait été organisée avec OC Transpo en avril grâce au personnel du bureau du conseiller Bob Monette (voir article en page 3). (Suite à page 2)

Traffic issues and environmental concerns were identified as the third and fourth highest priorities. Under traffic, proper completion of roadways, traffic light timing and final surfacing of neighbourhood streets were the top issues. For the environment, rehabilitating public properties, protecting the natural beauty of Cardinal Creek and its tributaries, enhancing tree planting programs, implementing a green box program and advancing community environmental initiatives were top priorities. If you are interested in helping advance these community priorities, we encourage you to participate in our meetings. The next CCCA meeting will be held June 7 at the South Fallingbrook Community Centre, 998 Valin at 7 p.m.

Environmental Responsibility Begins at Home

Thank you for making our community one of the most environmentally responsible in Ottawa. It is through your individual efforts that we have achieved great collective results. And it is by way of past successes that we can aim even higher.

Our 3rd Annual Community Clean Up on April 28 is a case in point. We had great turnout despite the rainy weather and picked up more garbage than ever. Congratulations and thank you to everyone who participated!

We are confident that our 2nd community tree planting project on Saturday, May 26 will be a similar success. Bring out the whole family to help plant more trees on the public lands along the Cardinal Creek path to strengthen the reforestation efforts we began last fall. Get involved by emailing environment@cardinalcreek.org.

The CCCA would like to thank the City of Ottawa for its support in making our community a greener place to live through this important initiative. Please let us know of other public areas where you would like to see trees planted in future or join us at our June 7 CCCA meeting where this will be a topic of discussion.

The CCCA would like you to consider the following ways you can help make our community even more sustainable:

- 1. Have a free smart thermostat installed by Hydro One to lower you're AC's consumption of electricity during peak summer hours;
- 2. Replace your outdoor porch lights with long-lasting, compact fluorescent bulbs. If this were done nationally it would be equivalent to taking 180,000 cars off the road:
- 3. Mulch your grass clippings. This will reduce the need for watering and save space in our landfills;
- 4. Recycle more, compost your organic waste and try to keep your weekly waste to one garbage bag; and
- 5. Install a rain barrel to reduce your water use and storm runoff, which pollutes our steams and rivers.

OC Transpo Service Changes

Pat Scrimgeour, Program Manager of Planning Service for OC Transpo, attended the April 5 CCCA meeting to provide residents with an update on recent and planned changes to bus service within the Cardinal Creek area. Of key note are the following changes planned for September/07:

- Route 22 –additional capacity will be added with larger buses and more frequent service.
- Route 94 –30 minute service in both directions during mid-day. 30 minute service downtown during pm peak period.
- Route 95 increased peak period service with more trips to Trim Road Park and Ride.
 - Route 135 Sunday service to follow regular route.
 - Route 136 Sunday service every 30 minutes.
