President's Message

American anthropologist and cultural commentator Margaret Mead once said: "Never doubt that a small group of thoughtful, committed citizens can change the world. Indeed, it's the only thing that ever has."

As a community activist, I've always been partial to this quotation, one that reinforces my belief that when residents band together for a common purpose, great things can be achieved.

This belief sustained me in the early days of the Equality East Citizens' Coalition, a group I co-founded in 2002 with a team of dedicated volunteers, to lobby the City of Ottawa for an east end community arts facility.

Our advocacy efforts then paid off with a financial commitment in the City's Capital Budget for the eventual construction of this much needed facility. While the project scope evolved and development delays were encountered, the end result culminated in the official opening of the Shenkman Arts Centre on Centrum Boulevard earlier this year.

I was recently reminded, once again, of the power we hold as citizens, both as individuals and as a collective, on two different occasions.

Firstly, I tip my hat off to East Village resident Murray Alce. A long-standing supporter and volunteer with the CCCA, Murray successfully lobbied city officials recently to improve pedestrian safety at the intersection of Trim and Innes roads. Residents may have noticed the intersection is now equipped with advance left-turn arrows for northbound and southbound vehicles, as well as pedestrian countdown timers, thanks in no small part to Murray's efforts and the support of our city councillors, Rob Jellett and Bob Monette.

Mot du président

La commentatrice et anthropologue américaine Margaret Mead a dit un jour: « Ne doutez jamais qu'un petit groupe de citoyens engagés et réfléchis puissent changer le monde. D'ailleurs, c'est la seule chose qui l'ait fait. »

En tant que militant communautaire, j'ai toujours eu un parti pris pour cette citation, qui soutient ma conviction que lorsque des citoyens se regroupent dans un intérêt commun, de grandes choses peuvent être accomplies. C'est cette certitude qui m'a soutenu lors de la création du groupe *Equality East Citizens' Coalition*, un regroupement de bénévoles engagés formé en 2002, dont je suis le co-fondateur, qui avait pour but de presser la municipalité de doter l'est de la ville d'un centre communautaire pour les arts.

Nos efforts ont porté fruit lorsque la ville s'est engagée financièrement à la construction de ce centre tant attendu. Le projet a évolué en ampleur, et des délais reliés au développement se sont manifestés, mais finalement le Centre des Arts Shenkman sur le boulevard Centrum a ouvert ses portes cette année.

Plus récemment, deux exemples du pouvoir que détiennent les résidents se sont manifestés tant au niveau individuel qu'au niveau collectif, et ce en deux occasions différentes.

En premier, je lève mon chapeau à Murray Alce, un résident de East Village, partisan et bénévole de l'ACCC. Murray a récemment convaincu les officiers municipaux d'améliorer la sécurité des piétons à l'intersection de Trim et Innes. Les résidents du secteur ont peut-être déjà constaté que l'intersection est maintenant équipée de feux de virage à gauche prioritaires dans l'axe nord-sud, et de chronomètres piétonniers, et ce, grâce aux efforts de Murray et à l'appui de nos deux conseillers municipaux Rob Jellett et Bob Monette. And speaking of Councillor Monette brings me to my next example. As you well know, since the CCCA's inception in 2006, we have lobbied long and hard on your behalf to accelerate development of Park 18B, the 10-acre active park to be built east of Trim Road, between the Springridge and East Village/Oakridge Gate subdivisions.

In short, funding pressures and construction timelines for the re-alignment of Trim Road are what have stalled development of this park. I won't steal Councillor Monette's thunder, but allow me to point you to the Councillor's column on page 3 for an important related announcement.

Kudos to Bob Monette for advocating tirelessly on our behalf to expedite the park's construction!

It is crucial to note that the Councillor's announcement relates to the DRAFT City of Ottawa 2010 Budget.

We need to individually and collectively voice our support for this budget measure to ensure its passage, so that construction work on Park 18B can begin as early as next summer. To show your support, please attend the east end budget consultation on December 3, or send an e-mail to bob.monette@ottawa.ca to share your views.

Volunteers needed for outdoor rinks

With the onset of colder weather comes also a call for residents to help keep winter activities accessible in their community.

The City of Ottawa has started looking for volunteers to keep its outdoor rinks going this coming season, with grants available to assist those who decide to volunteer.

Locally, the Cardinal Creek Community Association has applied to the city for funding under the outdoor rinks program to maintain and operate two outdoor rinks this season. One of the rinks is at Cassia Park in the Springridge subdivision while the other is at Glandriel Park in the East Village / Oakridge Gate neighbourhood.

The CCCA is also actively seeking rink volunteers for both locations, including the vacant positions of rink manager and co-manager. Students are reminded this is a good opportunity to fulfill the mandatory 40 volunteer hours of community service.

Councillor's Update: Trim Road Expansion

Dear Cardinal Creek Residents:

I am happy to announce that during this year's Draft Capital Budget there are 6 million dollars available to finish the design and construction work for Trim Road. This project was projected in the Transportation Master Plan to be completed in 2015; it is now expected to be finished two years ahead of schedule with a completion date of 2013.



At this time the budget for the city is not finalized, public consultation and subsequent debate are planned over the next 2 months. The City of Ottawa will vote on the final budget at the end of January 2010. The four east end councillors will be hosting a public budget meeting on December 3rd, 2009 at the Earl Armstrong Arena (2020 Olgilvie Road 2nd Floor) starting at 6:30 pm.

You can be assured that I, along with the other east-end councillors will be pushing to ensure that this item makes it through the budget process. I will keep you informed of the progress and invite you to attend the public meeting mentioned above. Please do not hesitate to contact me at www.bobmonette.ca with questions or comments.
