Roof Replacement

♦ I need to replace my roof. What should I do?

While we cannot make any guarantees, any settlement in this litigation would likely provide an option for persons who have already replaced their shingles. Such a provision is typical in these types of class actions.

Therefore, you should go ahead with the necessary roof replacement. Before removing the shingles, please take the following steps:

- 1. Take photographs of your roof. The photographs should be labeled to identify the slope or area of the roof shown. The photographs should include:
 - a. photographs of each roof slope showing the slope and the condition of the shingles
 - b. photographs showing the structure from a distance sufficient to show the entire structure, including views of all roof vents
 - c. the inside and outside of all soffits

Your roofing contractor should be able to assist you with taking the required photographs.

- Keep sample shingles. Once the shingles are removed, keep several sample shingles in a clean dry area. Make a note of from which slope the shingles were removed.
- 3. Contractor's report. If possible, have your roofing contractor write a short report regarding the conditions of the shingles and the ventilation of the roof.
- 4. Retain all related invoices. This includes:
 - a. your initial receipts/invoices relating to the installation of your IKO organic shingles
 - b. any receipts/invoices relating to repairing or replacing your IKO organic shingles, and
 - c. any receipts/invoices establishing expenses incurred as the result of a leak (eg: drywall repairs).

This information could be necessary for filing a claim.

♦ Do I have to use IKO shingles for my new roof? Can I install a metal roof?

While we cannot make any guarantees, any settlement in this litigation would likely provide an option for persons who do not want to use IKO shingles, including those who want to install a metal roof.
